


THIS SPRING: GOOD ENOUGH



SCHOLARSHIPS DEADLINE MARCH 31



Application forms for 2022 scholarships are now available in the church office as well as on the Cargill website (look under the heading “About” and then “Ways to Serve”). Four types of scholarships are available: the Cargill UMC General Education Scholarship, the Sidney Lingenfelter Trust Scholarship for those considering ministry, and two types of Howard W. Marquardt Trust Scholarships. The first is the Christian Education Grant

which is available for those interested in any type of religious study including individual classes and seminars. The other is the Vocational Education Grant. This is intended for anyone pursuing a degree in vocational, technical, or engineering related studies. However, if there is a lack of applicants in those fields, funds may be applied to degree work towards other vocations.

All members of the congregation or active participants that are interested in applying should complete a form and return it to the Cargill UMC office no later than Thursday, March 31st. Awards will be announced in late May. Any questions may be directed to the Scholarship Committee Chairperson, Jeff Schmoltdt at 752-9421.

NEWS FROM AROUND CARGILL UMC

Rev. Forrest Wells, former pastor of Cargill UMC and current South East District Superintendent, will retire effective July 1. Pastor Forrest has served 45 years in the Wisconsin Conference in thirteen congregations and been a superintendent assigned to four districts. He served as lead pastor at Cargill from 2007-2015.

Rev. Dr. Ebenezer Insor, now pastor at Burlington and English Settlement UMCs, will become Superintendent of the South East District.

Bishop Hee-Soo Jung also announced North East District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Kate Jones will be appointed as lead pastor of Wauwatosa Avenue UMC, Rev. Park Hunter will become the North East District Superintendent, and Rev. Jorge Mayorga, Director of Congregational Development, will retire. All changes will take effect July 1.

To extend a welcome to all, all bread used for Holy Communion is now gluten-free. This allows all of us to partake from the same bread, symbolic of our sharing from a common table. As always, the cup of Holy Communion contains unfermented grape juice.

Following Doug Farrell’s retirement, Lead Pastor Steve Scott will be the primary resource for our adult study and small groups. If you’re a small-group or class leader, please see him for any questions.

We continue to lift prayers for Stu Allen, our pastor of senior ministries and visitation. Pastor Stu is home and recuperating from hip surgery. He is connecting with members of our care list by telephone. We’re so grateful to members of our Caring Ministries team for assisting in this important ministry.

A new Nominations & Leadership Development Committee was formed late last year. As it gets to know one another better, this group will help guide Cargill UMC by finding and encouraging leaders from within the congregation to help shape its ministries. Members of the committee are Jim & Kris Borgerding, Dan & Nicole Calverley, Dianne Edson, Stew & LeAnn Hebel, Deb Horton, Maria Schoville, Nancy Sonntag, and pastors Seongmin Kim and Steve Scott.





EASTER FLOWERS


