Sadly, several clergy throughout the state, including ours, have been impersonated in a

series of fraudulent e-mails and text messages purportedly asking recipients for help. Often they'll say "I need a favor from you" or make a plea for someone to donate gift cards or other assistance for "someone in need." The best advice we can give: Please check the originating e-mail address or the text number where the message is from. Out-of-area text numbers or unrecognizable e-mail addresses are clues to spam. The messages also are typically poorly written and ungrammatical. We regret the inconvenience.

Rev. Ebenezer Insor was installed as the new South East District Superintendent during a worship service on Oct. 22 at Brown Deer UMC. Rev. Insor will serve as the D.S. for Cargill and other UMC congregations in our Rock County circuit.

A conference will be held Nov. 2-5 in Fort Wayne, Ind., to hold bishop elections in the North Central Jurisdiction, of which Wisconsin is a part. There are 10 candidates in this year's election, which has been delayed for two years because of the pandemic. It is not known exactly how many openings will be voted upon. Following elections, the conference also will appoint and/or reappoint bishops to geographic areas. Bishop Hee-Soo Jung has been Wisconsin's bishop for 10 years. One of this year's candidates is WI Assistant to the Bishop Dan Schwerin. The North Central Jurisdiction includes UMC conferences in nine states.



human body. Do we snack on prayer or do we feast on it?

Strengthening our prayer life can help us know if we're on the right track. Breakthrough Prayer is intended to help us.

In Eugene Peterson's book, *Run with Horses*, he tells the story of his frustration trying to remove the blade from his lawnmower. He had tried everything and finally his neighbor came over and asked if it was possible that he was actually tightening it, not loosening it.

Peterson said: What a great analogy for life. We think we need to keep pushing harder

and harder in one direction, when all we need to do is go another.

Breakthrough Prayer is a way to help us know.

First, what Breakthrough Prayer is *not*. It's not something to replace any other prayer you pray, or what we already pray in our church.

It's not better than other types of prayer; it's different. It's appropriate for us to pray for our needs and wants, but Breakthrough Prayer instead focuses on what God wants.

It is asking God to break through in new and even miraculous ways in our daily

life and in the life of the church.

You'll continue to hear more about Breakthrough Prayer in the days to come. You'll be invited to pray a Breakthrough Prayer with everyone in the congregation at the same time each day.

It will be simple and short. You won't be asked to get up in front of someone and pray.

Instead, you'll be invited to join with others in our congregation in asking God to open the doors for next steps, next direction, next possibilities.


