

LEARNING CENTER ADOPTS NEW NAME

The weekday childhood education program at Cargill United Methodist Church has adopted a new name: the Cargill Christian Learning Center.

The center, which will be celebrating its 40th anniversary later this year, was previously known as the Cargill Christian Preschool & Daycare.

The new name will better reflect the mission of the center, which incorporates learning into each age level. The center is more than a preschool, in that it serves children 6 weeks through 12 years old. And it offers more structure than what the term "daycare" suggests.



The Cargill Christian Learning Center, directed by Dawn Allen, has a full-time staff of 25 and enrollment of about 120 children. Programs include infant and toddler care, three-day preschool, half-day 4-year-old kindergarten (P4J), before-and after-school care, summer camp and transportation to Kennedy and Monroe elementary schools.

AROUND CARGILL UMC

It's not another abbreviation you need to memorize. But you'll be hearing a lot about MCCI: the Missional Church Consultation Initiative. In short, Cargill UMC was invited to take part as a way for vital churches to become more vital. It's all about giving us resources to be faithful in our ministry to God's calling. You'll be invited and asked to participate in several ways, such as Breakthrough Prayer and this month's Resource Refocus event on March 9. We are excited about God's possibilities for this congregation.

We have arranged for a local architectural firm to conduct a space-use analysis of our church building, particularly offices, classrooms and spaces for public gatherings. Although our building is a tremendous asset for our ministry, we want to make sure we are adapting to changing and growing needs. A focus of this effort is to make our building welcoming and accessible particularly for those visiting for the first time.

We've added security cameras throughout Cargill UMC, on both the Learning Center and church side of the building. We've also upgraded the central security monitoring system and have allowed key staff remote access to security monitors. This effort followed two days of security assessments in coordination with the Janesville Police Department.

Cargill UMC will host the South East Clergy
Day Apart with Bishop Jung on Wednesday,
March 29. About 50 clergy throughout the
district will attend for a time of worship, learning
and connection. The Day Apart is held in each
district annually, with various churches serving
as hosts.

A team of Cargill members with professional library backgrounds is inventorying the contents of the church library with the goal of updating and making the space more inviting and usable.

Natalie Albrecht is the new site director for Lake Lucerne Camp and Retreat Ministry. Last summer, she served as program coordinator for the camp. Natalie joined the Lake Lucerne staff from Cargill UMC, where she had served as coordinator of children's ministries.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

Application forms for 2023 scholarships are now available on-line on the Cargill website and the Facebook. Four separate types of scholarships are available:

- Cargill UMC General Education Scholarships for any member of any age continuing their education.
- Sidney Lingenfelter Trust Scholarships for those considering education in ministries.
- Two types of Howard W. Marquardt Trust Scholarships:
 - The Christian Education Grant which is available for those interested in any type of religious study. This includes individual classes and seminars.
 - The Vocational Education Grant. The primary intent of these scholarships is for anyone pursuing a degree in vocational, technical, or engineering related studies. However, if there is a lack of applicants in such fields, funds may be applied to degree work towards other vocations.

All members of the congregation or active participants that are interested in applying should download and complete a form or pick one up from the bulletin board in the church office. Please return it via mail or e-mail to the Cargill UMC office **no later than March 19, 2023**. Awards will be announced in late May.


