# Where is God inviting you?

Cargill United Methodist Church has committed to a way forward that involves <u>you</u>.

Our prayer is that God will use <u>all of us</u> to focus and maximize our fruitfulness for Christ.

The steps below are suited for next-level transformational ministry at Cargill.

#### Team 1 | Igniting Volunteerism: Dynamite Prayer

You'll help create a congregation-wide 28-Day Dynamite Prayer experience in February 2024. Dynamite Prayer gives everyone in the church the opportunity to pray, listen, and name what next step God is stirring at their heart level.

You'll partner with Pastor Steve to grow Cargill's generosity in supporting what God is doing in the church — now and into the future.

# **AROUND CARGILL S THE UMC**

Carmen Minch has accepted the position of interim kitchen coordinator. Carmen, a longtime volunteer at Cargill, is a retired teacher. She taught family consumer education at Brodhead High School for 31 years. In this part-time position at Cargill, Carmen will plan and prepare meals and refreshments for the Bountiful Blessings community meal and special church-related events as they are scheduled. She will collaborate with our existing hospitality and kitchen volunteers and continue to volunteer for United Women in Faith events.

We extend gratitude to those newly elected and re-elected to lay leadership for 2024, and those whose terms concluded in 2023. Their names are included in our Annual Report, which members received by e-mail Dec. 14 and also is available in the church office.

Cargill offers rides to and from Cedar Crest Senior Living for the 9a worship service each Sunday. The Cargill bus picks up riders at 8:30a and returns at 10:30a. To sign up each week, call the church office at 608-752-0548.

**Electric-assist door openers** have been installed on the main bathrooms outside the Sanctuary.

**As 2023 drew to a close**, 22,500 of the UMC's 30,000 congregations remained in the denomination rather than disaffiliate. A window of opportunity expired Dec. 31 that allowed churches to leave with their property intact over disagreements about gay marriage and ordaining gay clergy. In Wisconsin, 400 congregations, or about 90 percent, remained in the UMC. The breakaway conservative Global Methodist Church said it now has more than 4,000 congregations. United Methodist bishops have denounced some of the new denomination's recruitment tactics. Other congregations that left the UMC became independent or joined other denominations.

Officially, UMC doctrine still forbids same-sex marriage or allowing "self-avowed, practicing" gay people to become clergy. The next two sessions of the General Conference, in 2024 and 2026, will again take up proposals to eliminate those restrictions, now that one-fourth of churches have disaffiliated. The General Conference also will consider proposals to create regional conferences that would allow customization in how the church applies social teaching in each region of the world.

**UMC** bishops voted to add an extra General Conference in 2026, to follow the next meeting scheduled for April 23-May 4, 2024, in Charlotte, N.C. Bishops decided the extra session was needed to accomplish necessary work because the 2020 General Conference was lost to the pandemic.





# **MERCY & JUSTICE—2023 IN REVIEW**

- **Angel Tree** We adopted four families through ECHO, and fulfilled a total of 108 Christmas wishes.
- Banned Book Club This group of rebellious readers discussed nine books this year. All the books had been pulled off public and school libraries for various reasons. We discussed the reasons as well as the consequences of making books inaccessible to children and youth. The books we read were: "1984" by George Orwell, "The Bluest Eye" by Toni Morrison, "The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian" by Sherman Alexie, "A Wrinkle in Time" by Madeleine L'Engle, "The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Moon-Light", by Mark Haddon, "Gender Queer" by Maia Kobabe, "Catcher in the Rye" by J.D. Salinger, "Dear Martin" by Nic Stone, and "The 57 Bus" by Dashka Slater.
  - We also staffed a booth at the Multicultural Arts Fair at Hedberg library in August.
- **PURPLE Documentary Discussion** Eighteen people met to watch and discuss a short film capturing a small group of Americans with opposing viewpoints modeling what a healthy public discussion of contentious issues could look like, and coming to see some of the concerns and experiences behind each other's positions.
- **Community Conversations** The first two in a series of community conversations hosted by Cargill United Methodist Church, and presented by Pastor Steve Scott, about matters of faith & daily life. These events were entitled *Revisiting the First Amendment and Somewhere Under the Rainbow.*
- Small-Group Study Examining Gun Violence in America 25 people participated in this pastor-led study connecting our faith to our response to gun violence in our country.
- **VBS Mission Project** We staffed a table at the Babylon Marketplace, helping the children sort school supplies for the Midwest Mission Distribution Center.
- **Forgive Us Our Debt** We conducted a four-month campaign to raise money to pay off medical debt for our neighbors in Wisconsin and Illinois. With the \$7800 we raised, the non-profit organization RIPMedical Debt payed off \$1 Million in medical debt.
- **Speaking Across Differences** 30 church members spent a Saturday morning in a workshop led by the organization Resetting the Table. We learned and practiced several techniques we can use to make our difficult conversations respectful and effective.
- **Generous Giving** We continued to give financial and hands-on support to legacy organizations, such as ECHO, GIFTS, Project 16:49, Homeless High School Students, UMCOR. We also contributed to ministries in our own church, including Bountiful Blessings, LookingUp, United Women in Faith, Live Nativity.
- **Mulitply Your Blessings** We launched our congregational outreach program, encouraging members to take on projects to help their neighbors, or other church members.

## **HUMAN RELATIONS SUNDAY**

Human Relations Day — one of six United Methodist Special Sundays — is designed to celebrate and raise awareness to further the development of better human relations by involving congregations in community and youth outreach.

For more than a half-century, United Methodists have observed this churchwide Special Sunday in recognition of the message Jesus demonstrated during his life: All of God's children are important.

This year's observance will be January 13-14 in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday. Donations received help to build King's vision of "the beloved community" through programs such as Community Developers, United Methodist Voluntary Services, and Youth Offender Rehabilitation Programs.
