THE CURRENT OF SCRIPTURE

Jesus' disciples were tossed about all night long by headwinds on a stormy sea.

We heard that story from Scripture a few weeks ago in worship. It's part of an occasional series called "Bible Stories A to Z," focusing on a letter of the alphabet as a way to enter the stories of Scripture. This was "W is for Walking on Water."

As the Gospel of Matthew tells it, Jesus goes to the disciples by walking on water, immediately causing them to think he's a ghost. I can't blame them. What would you think?

Jesus says, "It's me. Take heart. Don't be afraid."

I've been in a wind-tossed sailboat, not at night but during a stormy afternoon that was dark as night, and I can tell you that the words "Don't be afraid" don't seem very assuring when your back is inches from the water on a tipping vessel and the crash of the bow thrusts you into 8-foot swells.

Then the story takes a real twist. Peter, one of the disciples, pleads for Jesus to let *him* walk on water. "Lord, if it is you, ask me to come to you on the water!"

Why on earth would Peter want to get out of a boat and step into

the storm-roiled waters that they spend the entire night fearing?

Anna Carter Florence suggests that maybe Peter wanted Jesus to prove he is who he says he is. It happens throughout Scripture:

- If you're the Son of God, turn this stone into a loaf of bread ...
- Throw yourself down from the tower of the temple ...
- If you are the Messiah, show us a sign ...
- Let yourself down from the cross. Save yourself and us! ...


We ask Jesus to prove who he says he is by performing a miracle to our specifications.

Here's where the story of the August sermon gets interesting.

The next day I received a thoughtful e-mail from one of that day's worshipers. She began:

"I have to say ... I didn't like your interpretation today of why in the world Peter would want to get out of the boat. I didn't like the idea that Peter was testing Jesus, and that he wanted to be able to perform a miracle. I felt like I needed to stand up for Peter. So, I came home and asked a different question: Why in the world wouldn't Peter want to get out of the boat? "

At this point, a preacher's heart warms. Not because someone's taking issue with the sermon. But because opening the text inspired someone to go with the stream of where Scripture might lead us.



She continued: "The boat is the safest thing they've got, but it's not exactly a good place to be. And here comes Jesus. If Jesus is walking on the water in the midst of a storm, then he's not getting bashed by waves or shoved around by gusts of wind.

"There had to be total peace around Jesus, in the midst of the storm. 'Be reassured. Don't be afraid. Recognize me.'

"Peter says, 'I want to be with you in that peace. I believe that I can join you. Peter wasn't looking to be able to walk on water. He was looking to come more fully into Jesus' amazing presence.' "

So I got to receive a message that day, as well. The greater point is that opening Scripture in worship led to a conversation, one deeper that can happen only on a Sunday morning. Consider it an invitation to you, as well, to engage the story of Scripture well beyond its original hearing.

Jesus came across an ailing man lying outside the Temple one day. He asked the man, "Do you want to be healed?"

Instead of answering yes or no, the man told Jesus why healing never worked for him. "No one ever comes to assist me, and others cut me off when I'm line to get help."

In other words, the man is complaining of being alone, even more than he complains about his ailments.

It is this knowledge that leads Jesus to answer the obstacle that has stood between the man and his healing: as Jesus speaks to him, he is no longer alone; the man has someone who will help him, advocate for him, be with him and acknowledge him as a human being with worth.

That's an excellent summation of the purpose of Cargill UMC's Looking Up ministry. It's about health and wellness. Looking Up's mission statement is:

"To prevent illness and injury through education and advocacy, empowering our Cargill community with optimal physical, emotional and spiritual health at all stages of life."



The next learning opportunity offered by Looking Up will be Wednesday, Sept. 4 (see above).


