Is it 2025 already?

Back in the Pleistocene era, also known as the year 2020, I came to Cargill UMC with open ears. Not only because I was new here, but because a pandemic had curtailed our in-person gatherings.

So I listened. Spoke with many of you. Attended small, outdoor gatherings. Connected in online small groups.

What I heard was optimism and resolve concerning the future of Cargill United Methodist Church.

The pandemic, you said, would hasten a future that was already upon us: Becoming the church of the next decades, not only celebrating the church of decades past.

members, committed leaders, and dedicated resources.

A church member recently shared with me a copy of a Cargill weekly newsletter from January 1983.

It indicated that worship attendance the previous weekend was 751, and church school attendance was 450.

(Interestingly, a related article called attention to a scheduled meeting regarding the anticipated budget deficit for 1983, as well as

an upcoming presentation to the United Methodist Men from a noted insect collector.)

Claire at the time, and I remember my home church and Sunday school classes were full then, as well.

What's happened since has been a seismic shift in religious practices in the U.S.. Congregational attendance and participation is significantly different today in much of the population.

But by any measure, quantitative or spiritual, God is actively working through the Cargill Church of today in inspiring, caring and meaningful ways.

Which brings me back to 2020. Out of my conversations with you, I crafted an outline called Cargill 2025. I told Cargill leaders it wasn't written on stone tablets, or even fancy parchment.

It was a pliable, evolving, working idea of how to grow in vital ways (not just in numbers but in spiritual depth) to meet the needs, hopes and dreams of God's people in the 2020s and 2030s and beyond.

Here are the five cornerstones of Cargill 2025:

1. Passionate worship

Enhance musically rich, liturgically centered worship (i.e. 9am service, and the intimate 5pm service).

Create a fresh expression of worship to reach new people (i.e. 10:30am service).

Develop vital online worship to reach new people.

2. Reaching across generations

Make Cargill a place of welcome for every age.

3. Making connections

Invite every person to connect in a small group within 3 months of their first visit.

4. Mercy and justice

Mercy: Invite and equip more persons for deeds of compassion.

Justice: Identify work(s) of peace, reconciliation or reform to which God has particularly called Cargill.

5. Rethink generosity

New ways to support Christ's work for today and beyond.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Application forms for 2025 scholarships are now available in the church office and online on the Cargill website and Facebook. Four separate types of scholarships are available: Cargill UMC General Education Scholarships for any member of any age continuing their education, the Sidney Lingenfelter Trust Scholarships for those considering education in ministries, and two types of Howard W. Marquardt Trust Scholarships. The first is the Christian Education Grant which is available for those interested in any type of religious study including individual classes and seminars. The other is the Vocational Education Grant. The primary intent of these scholarships is for anyone pursuing a degree in vocational, technical, or engineering related studies. However, if there is a lack of applicants in such fields, funds may be applied to degree work towards other vocations.

All members of the congregation or active participants that are interested in applying should pick up/download and complete a form. Please return it via mail or e-mail to the Cargill UMC office no later than March 23, 2025. Awards will be announced in late May. 

BANNED BOOK CLUB

In 1949, a violent sheriff who ruled Lake County, Florida chased down four young Blacks who dared to envision a future for themselves beyond the citrus groves. A young white woman cried rape, and the sheriff and Ku Klux Klan were determined to lynch the men who became known as "the Groveland Boys." Thurgood Marshall, then a young lawyer, refused to shrink from the fight. Even when the Klan murdered one of



Marshall's NAACP associates involved with the case, and Marshall had endured continual threats that he would be next, the future Supreme Court justice persisted in the case that formed his reputation as a crusader for civil rights.

On Wednesday, February 26, at 6:30pm, we will discuss this book, Devil in the Grove: Thurgood Marshall, the Groveland Boys, and the Dawn of a New America by Gilbert King, and why it has been banned in schools and public libraries across the country. Join us!
